This series encourages young students to learn basic Spanish vocabulary and increase their awareness and appreciation of Hispanic culture. It helps students develop interest in the geography of Spanish-speaking countries and reinforces skills and concepts taught in the regular language arts curriculum. *Amigos* uses the FLEX (Foreign Language Experience) approach, which emphasizes oral practice within real-life situations. Students hear and repeat Spanish words and phrases relating to numbers, colors, food, family members, animals, clothing, body parts, and much more.

1.) Perro Pepe encuentra su casa (Perro Pepe Finds A Home)

Perro Pepe arrives in the plaza.

2.) Perro Pepe tiene seis años (Perro Pepe Is Six Years Old)

Perro Pepe and Señorita Fernández play a game.

3.) Perro Pepe es un perro (Perro Pepe Is A Dog)

Señorita Fernández spills the rice; she sends Mark to the supermarket for more.

4.) Fernández's Funky Fonda: la gran inauguración (The Grand Opening) (Preview Title)

Everyone helps Señorita Fernández open her new shop.

5.) El gran secreto de Perro Pepe (Perro Pepe's Big Secret)

Perro Pepe asks his friends to keep his birthday a secret.

6.) El cumpleaños de Perro Pepe (Perro Pepe's Birthday)

The children throw a surprise birthday party for Perro Pepe.

7.) La caperucita roja (Little Red Riding Hood)

The children act out "Little Red Riding Hood."

8.) El sueño de Perro Pepe (Perro Pepe's Dream)

Perro Pepe dreams about animals.

9.) El regalo de Lu (Lu's Gift)

Lu shops in the Funky Fonda for a birthday gift for his brother.

10.) La escuela de Perro Pepe (Perro Pepe's School)

Perro Pepe sings a counting song.

11.) Mark va a la escuela? (Is Mark Going To School?)

Señorita Fernández tells Mark about the day she was late for school.

12.) La señorita y su perro (The Lady & Her Dog)

Perro Pepe and Señorita Fernández want to see a movie, but it is not playing today.

13.) Vamos al cine (Let's Go To The Movies)

Señor Garcia and Señorita Fernández make a date to go to the movies.

14.) Las flores (The Flowers)

The children bring flowers for Miriam, who is expected to arrive from Miami.

15.) Lunes de tormenta (Stormy Monday)

Miriam arrives at the Funky Fonda.

16.) Los colores de Miriam (Miriam's Colors)

The colors of several Latin nations' flags are highlighted.

17.) Ir o no ir (To Go Or Not To Go)

Señorita Fernández decides she will go to Spain to buy new merchandise.

18.) Buen viaje, Señorita Fernández (Good Trip, Señorita Fernández)

Señorita Fernández is given gifts as she leaves.

19.) En cual dirección doblar? (Which Way to Turn?)

Señorita Fernández sends a postcard; it is cold and sunny in Madrid.

20.) Es magia (It's Magic)

Fernanda and Perro Pepe present a magic show in the Funky Fonda.

21.) El problema de Miriam (Miriam's Problem)

Perro Pepe convinces Miriam that she can cook and sell.

22.) Ir de compras (Going Shopping)

With Miriam's help, Fernanda sets up a shop to sell her dolls, doll furniture, and baseball cards.

23.) Mi casa es su casa (My House Is Your House)

Señor Garcia builds a dollhouse for his niece; the toy television really works.

24.) Dónde está el perro? (Where Is The Dog?)

Miriam teaches the children a game.

25.) El cocinero (The Chef)

Perro Pepe practices cooking so he can try out as a TV chef.

26.) Perro Pepe en la televisión (Perro Pepe On Television)

Perro Pepe's audition is a fiasco.

27.) A Perro Pepe le duele un diente (Perro Pepe Has A Toothache)

Perro Pepe has a toothache, but is afraid to go to a dentist.

28.) Las formas (The Shapes)

A painting in the Cubist style arrives from Señorita Fernández.

29.) La reunión (The Reunion)

Señorita Fernández is welcomed home from her shopping trip.

30.) Mi hogar, dulce hogar (Home Sweet Home)

Everyone reminisces about the adventures they have shared in Plaza Central.
